"In the village, my brother John, who is 7 years old, has to fetch the water about 5 times a day from the nearest spring, which is about a kilometre from our house. He carries it on his head in a 10 litre jerry can."

In 2001 Adrian witnessed children carrying their own weight in water, not just from a local tap to their home (a matter of a few hundred yards) but kilometres away.

Rolling a Water Barrel was an instant solution, but they were in the UK, the problem was in Africa and Asia and one not addressed by any other organisation.

It took until 2011 through sheer determination, talks with Unicef, finding a provider of suitable containers and gaining support, for Adrian to see his vision come to life. Over 300 barrels have now been delivered to Uganda, Sierra Leone, Kenya and Zambia and there's already more on the way to Zanzibar and Senegal.

With your support, for £30 per barrel, which includes the cost of delivery, Roll Out The Barrel can continue to provide this simple solution to the problem of collecting and transporting clean water for home use.

**Roll Out The Barrel intend that women and children who collect water, even from the closest of water sources or supply will no longer need to carry it, by hand, on their backs, on their heads or over their shoulders, by providing them with a simple push/pull 30 or 50 litre capacity Roll-Along Water Barrel with a handle and rubber tyres.**

Apart from the obvious advantage of not having to carry water, the Rotary Barrels also make it:

- 👁️ A lot quicker and easier to collect water
- 👁️ Much less strenuous and dangerous for children
- 👁️ Easier to collect more water than traditional methods
- 👁️ The water collected remains in a sealed container reducing loss through spillage or further contamination
- 👁️ The opportunity for measured use rather than waste when pouring, offering economy of scale
- 👁️ Less trips per day/week to and from the water source giving the person time to do other things during their day



## The Tierra del Fuego or Bust 25,000 Mile Challenge

Rotarian Michael, a member of the District 1100 eClub ([www.1100rotaryclub.org](http://www.1100rotaryclub.org)) and his cousin fly into Halifax, Nova Scotia from Bristol UK, at the end of May 2013. Then they will ride 25,000 miles on their Yamaha Tenere XT6600Z motorbikes all the way down to Tierra del Fuego, arriving about 20th November. A route and distance infrequently travelled.



"We will be unsupported and reliant upon our own abilities to face the certain adversities that will greet us on parts of this hazardous route.

"We will be visiting parts of the world where people find it hard just to survive for lack of clean water and food. We fully expect to witness hardship and deprivation beyond our comprehension.

"We aim to raise £25,000 to support Roll Out The Barrel as they provide a simple, achievable solution to the problem of fresh water harvesting.
